

Crochet amigurumi bull pattern

pattern

- Uses US crochet terms
 - Use any yarn you like - the size of the final piece will depend on the yarn weight.
 - Feel free to switch up the colours!
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- You will need a crochet hook, at least two different yarn colours, a sewing needle, scissors and a stitch marker (you could use a safety pin if you don't have one). You will also need some filling to stuff your amigurumi with.
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- ABBREVIATIONS (US TERMS)
 - Ch – Chain
 - Inc – Increase
 - Inv Dec – Invisible Decrease
 - MC – Magic Circle
 - Sc – Single Crochet
 - Sl St – Slip Stitch
 - St – Stitch

head

Using brown yarn

- Round 1. Sc 6 in MC. (6 sts)
- Round 2. Sc inc 6. (12 sts)
- Round 3. (Sc inc 1, sc 1) 6 times. (18 sts)
- Round 4. Sc 1, (sc inc 1, sc 2) 5 times, sc inc 1, sc 1. (24 sts)
- Round 5. (Sc inc 1, sc 3) 6 times. (30 sts)
- Round 6. Sc 2, (sc inc 1, sc 4) 5 times, sc inc 1, sc 2. (36 sts)
- Round 7. (Sc inc 1, sc 5) 6 times. (42 sts)
- Rounds 8-15. Sc around. (42 sts)
- Round 16. (Inv dec 1, sc 5) 6 times. (36 sts)
- Round 17. Sc 2, (inv dec 1, sc 4) 5 times, inv dec 1, sc 2. (30 sts)
- Round 18. (Inv dec 1, sc 3) 6 times. (24 sts)
- Round 19. Sc 1, (inv dec 1, sc 2) 5 times, inv dec 1, sc 1. (18 sts)

At this point, before decreasing any further, it's a good idea to stuff the Amigurumi ball with polyfill or any filling material you normally use. As you move onto the next step, keep stuffing ball as and when needed before fastening off.

- Round 20. (Inv dec 1, sc 1) 6 times. (12 sts)
- Round 21. Inv dec 6. (6 sts).

Fasten off.

Remember to use a stitch marker at the end of each round so you don't lose your place!



muzzle

Using lighter colour yarn.

- Chain 6 - you will be crocheting around the whole chain.
- Round 1. Start in second ch from the hook, 4sc, 3sc in last stitch, 3sc, inc (12 sts)
- Round 2-3. 3sc, 3 inc, 3sc, 3 inc (18 sts)
- Round 4. Sc around (24 sts)
- Fasten off leaving a long tail for sewing.



ears (make 2x)

Inner ear - use light colour

- Round 1. Make a magic ring. 6sc in ring (6 sts)
- Round 2. 6 inc. (12 sts)
- Fasten off.

Outer ear - use brown colour

- Round 1. Make a magic ring. 6sc in ring (6 sts)
- Round 2. 6 inc. (12 sts)
- Don't fasten off, crochet the inner and outer ears together, wrong sides facing.
- Round 3. Crochet through both inner and outer ears - (3sc,inc)* (15 sts)
- Round 4. 8 inc, sl st 7 (until the end)
- Fasten off. Leave long tail for sewing.

horns (make 2x)

Use light colour

- Round 1. Make a magic ring. 6sc in ring (6 sts)
- Round 2. Sc around (6 sts)
- Round 3. (1sc, inc)* repeat around (9 sts)
- Round 4-5. Sc around (9 sts)
- Round 6. (2sc, inc)* repeat around (12 sts)
- Round 7-8. Sc around (12 sts)
- Fasten off. Leave tail for sewing.
- Lightly stuff horns to keep shape.

assembly

- Sew muzzle onto front of the head - stuff lightly to keep the shape
- Embroider two lines onto the muzzle for the nostrils (you could use the brown colour).
- Sew the ears onto each side of the head.
- Sew the horns next to each ear near the top of the head.
- Add safety eyes if using them or use white yarn to embroider two eyes onto the head - I then drew black circles on them for the pupils.
- Sew in your ends - et voila!

If you'd like to make a body, I'd recommend following a pattern for a cow or horse shape, then sewing your head onto what you've made.
