HOW YOUR FUNDRAISING HELPS

£11 could pay for a delicious **home-cooked meal** for people in our Inpatient Units.

£21 could pay for a teddy bear with the **recording of a loved one's voice** for children to treasure forever.

£41 could fund one hour of our Living Well Centre services which help patients socialise and look after their wellbeing.

£89 could pay for a nurse to visit a patient in their home so they can be cared for in the place of their choice.



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£95 could pay for a specialist bereavement support session to help those who have lost a loved one.



£166 could pay for an **Occupational** Therapist to visit a patient at home, helping them be as independent as possible during the time that remains.

£356 could fund a **whole day of** nursing in the community to ensure we reach people who need us most.

£525 could pay for 24 hours of nursing support in our Inpatient Units, offering specialist care from our team of medical experts.

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BECOME A "BULL BOSS"







For 8 weeks from July, you can find all the bulls around Birmingham city centre and local surrounding neighbourhoods. The trail will be made up of 40 bulls and 80 calves, each with a unique design to admire.

THREE STEPS TO GET MOO-VING

Get the map. Download the Bulls in the City app from the Apple or Android Store in July 2025. Or you can get a map from one of our stockists, or the Bulls in the City website.

Plan your route. Map out what order you plan to visit the bulls in and what method of transport you'll be taking.

Get sponsored. Ask friends and family for donations. As a school/group you can set up a JustGiving page at www.justgiving.com/ campaign/bulls-in-the-city or use the sponsorship form included in this pack.

After the trail, anyone who has raised £100 or more will be awarded a coveted Bull Boss certificate!

Plus, all Bull Bosses will be entered into a prize draw to win a Birmingham Hospice hoody.

BULL-RILLIANT FUNDRAISING IDEAS

BAKE SALE

Whether you sell cakes at school, a local club, or to friends and family – this good old-fashioned fundraising idea never fails! There are lots of bull-themed cupcake recipes online if you fancy giving them a go.

GET YOUR HERD TOGETHER

Host a coffee morning, an afternoon tea, pizza party or BBQ to raise money for Birmingham Hospice. Why not run a raffle to boost your fundraising?!



Organise a sponsored run/walk in school or club to raise vital funds for the hospice. You could even encourage your young people to get creative and make their own bull horns for the run.

BE MORE BULL

Are your young people as strong or as fast as a bull? Set your pupils/group members a fitness challenge, like doing 100 squats a day for the month, or running a challenging distance. Believe it or not, bulls can swim, so how about trying a sponsored swim!

SEASONAL FAYRE

Host a Christmas, Easter or Summer Fayre, inviting your community to come along and join the fun. Stalls could include bull themed activities and prizes, e.g. Pin the horns on the bull.

ORGANISE A QUIZ

There are some bull-themed questions you could use on page 11 of this guide!

HAVE A DRESS-DOWN DAY AT SCHOOL

Ask people to donate £2 to dress down for the day. You could even make it cowboy themed or get yourselves some horns to wear!

Whether you set your target at £1,000 or more, every penny will help people to live well with their illness.


YOU'RE HELPING TO MAKE **EVERY MOMENT MATTER**

When John reached the point where he needed end of life care, he and his wife Marie were determined that he would receive it at Birmingham Hospice.

Marie said: "When I was told there was nothing else that could be done for John, I knew I wanted him to have his final days being looked after at the hospice. He worked as a Community **First Responder for West Midlands** Ambulance Service and, as soon as there was a bed available, they sent a patient transport team to move him.

"Even within the first 10 minutes, the staff at the hospice did more for John than others had done in weeks; I was told to just be with him, and it was not down to me to be his nurse. They looked after us both so well.

"All of our friends and our six children - Billie, Josh, Sophie, Ryan, Harry and Kairi - could spend as much time with John as they needed, day or night. We got married just before he took his final breath. Birmingham Hospice did so much for us to make our day so special."

RAFFLES AND LOTTERIES

If you're selling raffle tickets ahead of the event date, you'll need a small society lottery licence. For more information visit www.gamblingcommission.gov.uk

INSURANCE

If you're organising your own event, our public liability insurance will not cover your event and/ or be liable for any loss or injury. You may need to ensure that any events are covered by your own insurance policies..

BUCKET COLLECTIONS

If you borrow any of our collection buckets it is your responsibility to ensure they are kept safely sealed. You may need a licence to collect in a public space - visit birmingham.gov.uk for more information.

PHOTOGRAPHS

You must have the written permission of parents/ carers to take or use photos of children under 18.

RISK ASSESSMENT

Before holding any event, please carry out a risk assessment. We can provide a template on request.

OUR LOGO

If you'd like to use the Birmingham Hospice or Bulls in the City logos to help promote your event, please check with us.

FOOD SAFETY

If you are providing any food, including cakes, please read the Food Standards Agency's quidelines on food safety. These can be found on their website: www.food.gov.uk

We can reclaim up to 25% of every £1 donated to us through Gift Aid. Please encourage your donors to complete a Gift Aid declaration when they donate - or use JustGiving.


